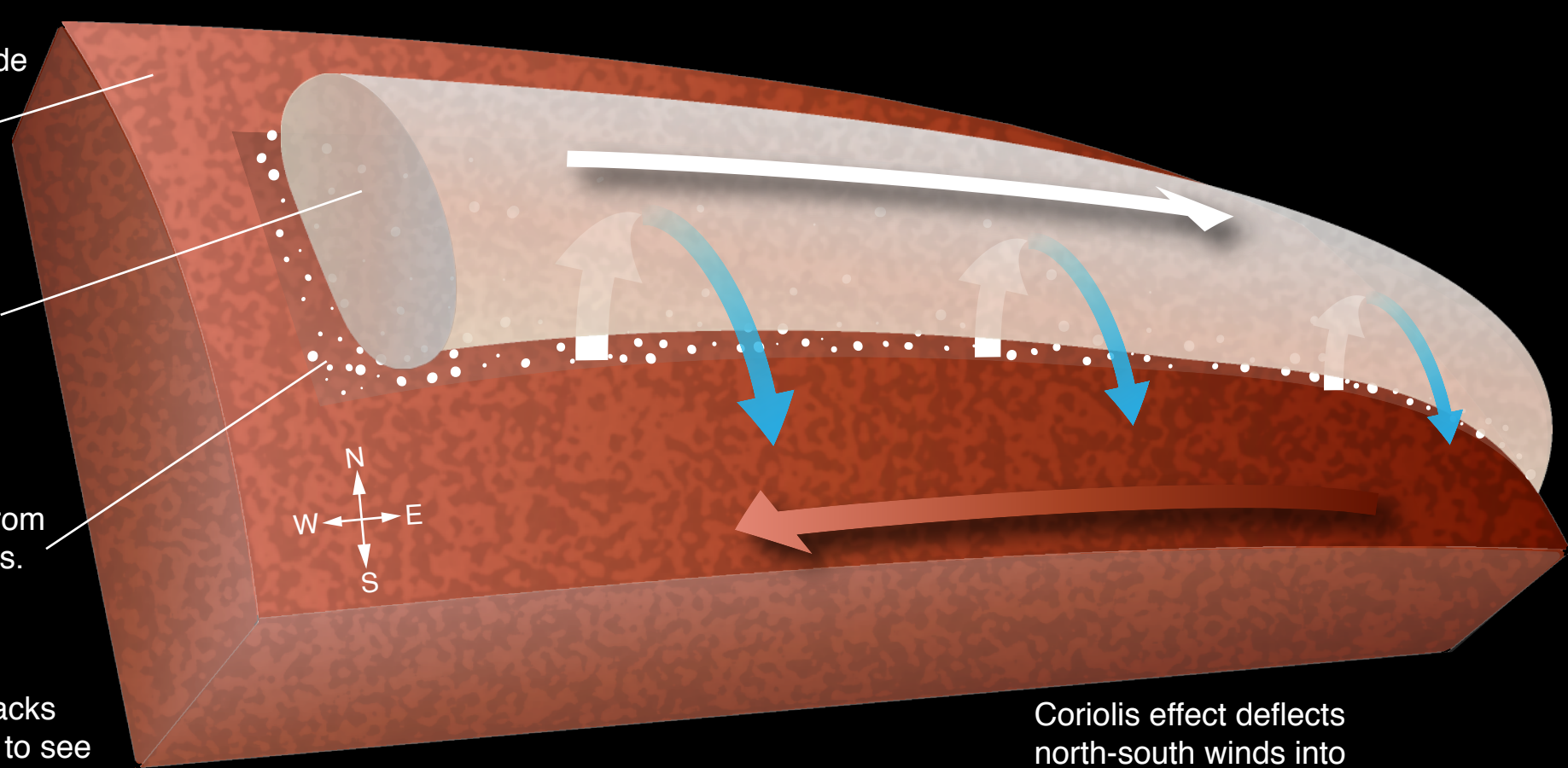


Reddish clouds of ammonium hydrosulfide blanket Jupiter at low altitude.

Rising air forms white ammonia clouds at high altitudes.

Ammonia snow falls from the high altitude clouds.

Falling material thus lacks ammonia, allowing us to see the reddish clouds below.



Coriolis effect deflects north-south winds into east-west winds.
